You will also be given the opportunity to be admitted to practice before the United States District Courts for both the Northern and Southern Districts of Mississippi and the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals.

The Bar Admissions Ceremony will take place at 3:00 P.M. on Thursday, September 25, at the Thalia Mara Hall located at 255 E. Pascagoula Street in Jackson. Judges from each of the above courts will administer oaths to you. To allow you sufficient time to register with the court officials prior to the ceremony, please be present at 1:00 p.m. No one will be allowed to participate in the ceremony without having his or her applications processed first.

Enclosed is a set of instructions for admission to all of the courts mentioned. Please carefully review the enclosed instructions prior to the ceremony. Again, congratulations!

Instructions for Admission to The Mississippi Bar, State Trial Courts, Supreme Court of Mississippi, U.S. District Courts in Mississippi and U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals

*If you plan to pay court fees in cash, please bring exact change for each court.
If paying by check, please have your individual court checks made out in advance.*

Admission to be licensed to practice law in Mississippi - (Required)

Chancery Court

You must first be admitted in either the Chancery Court of your residence; the Chancery Court of the County in which you intend to practice law or in the Chancery Court of Hinds County. Representatives from the Hinds County Chancery Court will be present at the ceremony to process your application. To be admitted in Chancery Court, you will need to bring for filing an Exparte Petition (signed and notarized prior to the day of admittance with Exhibit A attached (see sample), an Oath also signed but not notarized, and a Decree. (A sample is enclosed for each pleading for you to retype). **We will not accept sample forms for original pleadings. You must retype the sample.** You will need an original Petition, Oath and Decree with one extra copy of the Decree to be certified by the Deputy Chancery Clerks. The copy of the decree will be needed for admission before the Supreme Court. If you have already filed for admission before the ceremony, you will need two certified copies of the Decree for the Supreme Court. There is a \$92.00 filing fee for admissions to Chancery Court of Hinds County. Make check payable to Chancery Clerk of Hinds County. If you have any questions regarding admission to Chancery Court, call Hinds County Chancery Clerk's Office at (601) 968-6540.

The Mississippi Bar

If you are attending the ceremony:

Membership in The Mississippi Bar is mandatory in order to practice law in Mississippi. Representatives from the Membership Records Department will be present at the ceremony to accept your Enrollment Form (blue sheet enclosed) and your fee. The fee for new members is \$100.00. Make check or money order payable to The Mississippi Bar. Each year, enrolled members are billed for dues on August 1. If you have any questions, please contact Nikki McIntyre at (601) 355-4619; nmcintyre@msbar.org.

If you are NOT attending the ceremony:

You must contact separately the Chancery and Supreme Courts. You must be sworn into a Chancery Court in the State of Mississippi to practice law in this state. When you are sworn in to a Chancery Court, you are sworn in to practice law in Mississippi. After you are sworn in to a Chancery court, you must complete and mail the 1) Enrollment Form, 2) a copy of your Chancery Court Decree, and 3) your check for \$100.00 to: The Mississippi Bar, Membership Department, P.O. Box 2168, Jackson, MS 39225-2168.

State Law requires that you must be a member of The Mississippi Bar in order to practice law in Mississippi (§ 73-3-119). You must be sworn in to a Chancery Court, and we must receive your application and your payment before you are licensed to practice law in Mississippi. Your bar number is provided by the Mississippi Supreme Court.

Supreme Court

A representative from the Supreme Court Clerk's office will be present at the ceremony to process all applicants. You will need to present the certified copy of your Chancery Court Admissions Decree and a copy of your Bar Admission certificate. You will receive your bar number at this table. There is a \$30.00 fee for admission to the Mississippi Supreme Court and checks should be made payable to Supreme Court Clerk. If you have any questions concerning the Supreme Court procedure, please call Supreme Court Clerk's office at (601) 359-3694.

Admission to U.S. District Courts in Mississippi and U.S. Court of Appeals - (Optional)

Northern and Southern Districts

If you wish to be admitted to the U.S. District Court for the Southern or Northern District of Mississippi, you must complete an application for each court (enclosed white cards marked for specific district). There is a \$186.00 fee for each U.S. District Court. Separate checks should be made payable to U.S. District Clerk. Representatives for each court will be present at the ceremony to process applications. You will note on the U.S. District Court application that you will need the signature of a sponsoring attorney who is admitted to the district court(s) to which you are applying. Prior to registration, please have your sponsoring attorney sign legibly the section entitled "Admitted on motion of: (movant)" and write your Social Security Number and a firm or permanent address on the form. You will receive your Bar Number from the Supreme Court registration table on the day of the ceremony. If you have any questions concerning admission to the Northern District, please contact the Clerk of the Northern District (Oxford) at (662) 234-1971. If you have any questions regarding the Southern District, please contact the Clerk of the Southern District (Jackson) at (601) 608-4000. These instructions for the Northern and Southern Districts are for the Bar Admissions Ceremony only. If you are unable to appear at the Bar Ceremony for admission in these courts, then you will be required to personally appear before a Judge or Magistrate Judge in accordance with the regulations of Uniform Local Rule 83.1

U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit

Once admitted to the Supreme Court of Mississippi or a U.S. District Court, you are then eligible for admission to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. If you wish to be admitted, complete the enclosed application and bring it with you to the ceremony. (Do not use P.O. Box numbers. Give physical address.) Please note that the application must be notarized (there will be a notary public at this registration table) and must be signed by a sponsoring attorney who is admitted to the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals. There is an initial application fee of \$226.00. Checks should be made payable to Clerk, United States Court. Thereafter, members of the Bar must renew their admission every five years. There is a \$50.00 fee for each renewal. Please contact the Clerk's office in New Orleans at (504) 310-7793 with any questions.

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions

Please arrive between 1:00 and 2:00 p.m. for registration. The ceremony begins at 3 p.m. Please arrive as early as possible to ensure adequate time to register.

There will be reserved seats for the new admittees, but not for family members. Seating for family members is on a first come basis, but there are plenty of seats.

If you live and practice law out of state, you must physically appear before a Chancellor in Hinds County in order to be sworn in to legally practice law in Mississippi. The Chancery Court Petition can be notarized by a non-Mississippi notary if you live out of state. If you are unable to be present for the Bar Admissions Ceremony, then you must make an appointment to appear before a Chancellor in Hinds County to be sworn in, following directions under the Chancery Court section, at another time by traveling to Jackson, MS.

If you reside and practice law in another county in Mississippi and get sworn in by a Chancellor outside of Hinds County before the ceremony, be sure to stop by the Hinds County Chancery Court table to pick up your certificate at the Bar Admissions Ceremony.

You do not need to have your sponsoring attorney present for admission to Federal Courts. Just have them sign on the correct line for the Northern District and Southern District cards and the 5th Circuit form if you wish to be admitted to those courts. If you were not able to find an attorney sponsor for the Northern District, Southern District or 5th Circuit Court of Appeals, there will be an attorney seated at the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals registration table who is able to sign for you.

On the Northern and Southern District cards, the new admittee's information should be filled out here. The sponsoring attorney need only sign the card under "Admitted on Motion of:" No other information is required from the sponsoring attorney.

There will be a notary public present to sign any 5th Circuit Court of Appeals Application forms, and he will be seated at the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals registration table.

On the Bar's Enrollment Application, write in Judge Patricia D. Wise on the "Admitted by whom" line.



Note Regarding Newly Graduated Military Attorney Status:

In August 2008, we amended 5th CIR. R. 46.1 to allow an admission fee waiver for newly graduated lawyers admitted to practice in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas; and on initial extended active duty orders for service in the Judge Advocate General's Corps of the armed forces.

To claim an exemption please:

- 1) Mark the Newly Graduated Military Attorney box;
- 2) Provide a paper or electronic copy of your law school transcript, or other document from you school showing your graduation date;
- 3) Provide a paper or electronic copy of your orders directing you to report for extended active duty with the Judge Advocate General's Corps;
- 4) Provide documentation of bar admission.
