

TIME STANDARD SUMMARY REPORT

(REVISED 07/23/12)

The purpose of this report is to provide the number of cases and referrals that are in compliance, as well as non compliance, according to the time standard rules for Delinquency and Protection cases. Furthermore, this report provides a breakdown of the level of compliance with time standards for milestones within a case's timeline (detention, intake, petition, etc.). As delinquency and protection cases follow different timelines, their information

is presented in separate charts on this report. The Time Standard Summary report can be run for a specific date range (based on the Case Intake Date) and intake type (Figure 1). If multiple counties are selected, county information will be displayed two (2) counties per page. A Report Total section will be displayed on the last page of the report. This section contains total information for all counties selected in the report. Courts can only see reports for the county or districts in which they have jurisdiction.



REPORT BREAKDOWN

The Time Standards Summary Report is broken down into three (3) sections: case total information for the court, Delinquency Cases, and Protection Cases. Below, this document will attempt to breakdown and describe each section in detail.

CASE TOTAL INFORMATION

The first section (Figure 2) displays subtotal and total information for the selected court. This information is broken down according to the Case Type.

Delinquency Column (Figure 2, red highlight)

This column displays only Delinquency case information. The *Cases With Referrals* row displays the total number of Delinquency cases that contain referrals for the time period selected. The *Cases Without Referrals* row displays the number of Delinquency cases that do not have referrals entered. These cases are automatically considered non

compliant. The *Referrals* row displays the total number of Delinquency referrals for the selected time period. This number may be higher than the Case total due to multiple referrals in some cases.

Protection Column (Figure 2, blue highlight)

This column displays only Protection case information. The *Cases With Referrals* row displays the total number of Protection cases for the time period selected. The *Cases Without Referrals* row displays the number of Protection cases that do not have referrals entered. These cases are automatically considered non compliant. The *Referrals* row displays the total number of Protection referrals for the selected time period. This number may be higher than the Case total due to multiple referrals in some cases.

Total Column (Figure 2, purple highlight)

This column displays totals for both Delinquency and Protection columns.

Delinquency Cases (Figure 3) is the second section of this report. Information displayed here is only related to delinquency cases that occurred within the selected court and with an Intake Date within the selected time frame.

DETENTION COLUMN

The total number of Delinquency Cases that contain referrals and the number of Custody cases for the time period are displayed at the top of the column (Figure 4). The total number of Delinquency cases should match the number at the top of the report for the selected court.

Both the Compliance and Non compliance rows added together should equal the number of Custody cases displayed at the top of the column.

Non Compliance

- *Delinquent Child* - Detention hearing was not held within 2 days (48hrs) of the date that custody was removed from the Primary Physical Custodian (PPC) or the detention hearing was not waived.ⁱ
- *CHINS* - Detention hearing was not held within 24hrs of the date that custody was removed from the PPC or the detention hearing was not waived.ⁱⁱ
- A Detention hearing was not held within 2 days (48 hrs) of the Case Intake date and no custody records were entered.
- Custody was removed from the PPC within 5 days of the Case Intake date and no Detention hearing was held.

Compliance

- *Delinquent Child* - Detention hearing was held within 2 days (48hrs) of the removal of custody from the PPC.
- *CHINS* - Detention hearing was held with 24hrs of the removal of custody from the PPC.
- A Detention hearing was held within 2 days (48 hrs) of the Case Intake date with no custody records entered.

The time frames above do not include weekends and statutory holidays.

INTAKE COLUMN

The total number of Delinquency Referrals for the selected time period is displayed at the top of the column (Figure 5). This number should match the number at the top of the report.

Both the Compliance and Non Compliance rows added together should equal the number of referrals displayed at the top of the column.

Non Compliance

- *Custody Cases* - The Petition was not filed within 5 days of the Detention hearing.
- *Non-Custody Cases* - The Petition was not filed within 10 days of the Document Date of the last Intake Order recorded to a case's General Docket; or, if no such Intake Order has been recorded, the Petition was not filed within 10 days of the Formal Referral Ordered date.ⁱⁱⁱ

Referrals that are found to be non compliant are automatically considered non compliant in the Adjudication column.

Compliance

- *Custody Cases* - The Petition was filed within 5 days of the Detention hearing.
- *Non-Custody Cases* - The Petition was filed within 10 days of the Document Date of the last Intake Order recorded to a case's General Docket ; or, if no such Intake Order has been recorded, the Petition was filed within 10 days of the Formal Referral Ordered date.

The number of referrals that were ordered Formal is displayed at the top of this column. This number may not be the same as the number of referrals shown at the top of the report due to some referrals being dismissed or ordered informal.

Non Compliance

- *Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was not held within 21 days of the date that custody was last removed from the PPC.^{iv}
- *Non-Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was not held within 90 days of the Petition Filing date. For Truancy Referral types, the Adjudication hearing was not held within 21 days from the date of the last filed Petition.^v

Referrals that were found to be non compliant in the Petition column are automatically considered non compliant in the Adjudication column.

Compliance

- *Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was held within 21 days of the date that custody was last removed from the PPC.
- *Non-Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was held within 90 days of the Petition Filing date. For Truancy Referral types, the Adjudication hearing was held within 21 days from the date of the last filed Peition.

DISPOSITION COLUMN

The number of Adjudicated Referrals that were proved is displayed at the top of this column.

Both the Compliance and Non Compliance rows added together should equal the number of referrals displayed at the top of the column.

PROTECTION CASES

Protection Cases is the second section of this report. Information displayed here is only related to protection cases that occurred within the selected court and with an Intake Date within the selected time frame.

SHELTER COLUMN

Total number of Protection Cases and the number of custody cases for time period are displayed at the top of the column FIGURE 9

(Figure 10). The total number of Protection cases should match the number at the top of the report for the selected court.

Both Compliance and Non compliance rows added together should equal the number of Custody cases displayed at the top of the column.

Non Compliance

- The Shelter hearing was not held within 48hrs of the date that custody was removed from the PPC.
- A Shelter hearing was not held within 2 days (48 hrs) of the Case Intake date and no custody records were entered.
- Custody was removed from the PPC within 5 days of the Case Intake date and no Shelter hearing was held.

Compliance

- The Shelter hearing was held within 48hrs of the date that custody was removed from the PPC.¹
- A Shelter hearing was held within 2 days (48 hrs) of the Case Intake date with no custody records entered.

The time frames above do not include weekends and statutory holidays.

REASONABLE EFFORTS MADE COLUMN

The total number of Protection cases is displayed at the top of this column. This should match the number of displayed at the top of the report for the selected court.

Total number of Protection Referrals for the selected time period is displayed at the top of the column. This number should match the number at the top of the report.

Both the Compliance and Non Compliance rows added together should equal the number of referrals displayed at the top of the column.

- *Custody Cases* - The Petition was not filed within 5 days of the Shelter hearing.
- *Non-Custody Cases* - The Petition was not filed within 10 days of the Document Date of the last Intake Order recorded to a case's General Docket; or, if no such Intake Order has been recorded, the Petition was not filed within 10 days of the Formal Referral Ordered date.

Non Compliance

- *Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was not held within 30 days of the Shelter hearing.^{viii}
- *Non-Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was not held within 90 days of the Petition Filing date. For Educational Neglect Referral types, the Adjudication hearing was not held within 21 days from the date of the last filed Petition.^v

Referrals that were found to be non compliant in the Petition column are automatically considered non compliant in the Adjudication column.

Compliance

- *Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was held within 30 days of the Shelter hearing.^{viii}
- *Non-Custody Cases* - The Adjudication hearing was held within 90 days of the Petition Filing date. For Educational Neglect Referral types, the Adjudication hearing was held within 21 days from the date of the last filed Peition.^v

DISPOSITION COLUMN

The number of Adjudicated Referrals that were proved is displayed at the top of this column.

Both the Compliance and Non Compliance rows added together should equal the number of referrals displayed at the top of the column.

STATUTES

[i §43-21-301\(3\)](#)

The judge or his designee may issue an order to a law enforcement officer, the Department of Human Services, or any suitable person to take a child into custody for a period not longer than forty-eight (48) hours, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and statutory state holidays if it appears that there is probable cause to believe that:

- (a) The child is within the jurisdiction of the court; and
- (b) Custody is necessary; custody shall be deemed necessary:
 - (i) When a child is endangered or any person would be endangered by the child; or
 - (ii) To insure the child's attendance in court at such time as required; or
 - (iii) When a parent, guardian or custodian is not available to provide for the care and supervision of the child; and
- (c) There is no reasonable alternative to custody.

[ii §43-21-301\(6\)\(a\)](#)

No child who has been accused or adjudicated of any offense that would not be a crime if committed by an adult shall be placed in an adult jail or lockup. An accused status offender shall not be held in secure detention longer than twenty-four (24) hours prior to and twenty-four (24) hours after an initial court appearance, excluding Saturdays, Sundays and statutory state holidays, except under the following circumstances: a status offender may be held in secure detention for violating a valid court order pursuant to the criteria as established by the federal Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 2002, and any subsequent amendments thereto, and out-of-state runaways may be detained pending return to their home state.

[iii §43-21-451](#)

All proceedings seeking an adjudication that a child is a delinquent child, a child in need of supervision, a neglected child or an abused child shall be initiated by the filing of a petition. Upon authorization of the youth court, the petition shall be drafted and filed by the youth court prosecutor unless the youth court has designated some other person to draft and file the petition. The petition shall be filed within five (5) days from the date of a detention hearing or shelter hearing continuing custody. Unless another period of time is authorized by the youth court or its designee, in noncustody cases the petition shall be filed within ten (10) days of the court order authorizing the filing of a petition. The court may, in its discretion, dismiss the petition for failure to comply with the time schedule contained herein.

If the child is in detention, the hearing shall be held as soon as possible but not later than twenty-one (21) days after the child is first detained by the youth court unless the hearing be postponed:

- (a) upon motion of the child;
- (b) where process cannot be completed; or
- (c) upon a judicial finding that a material witness is not presently available. If the adjudicatory hearing is not held or postponed for the aforesaid reasons, the child may be released from detention.

[v §43-21-551\(1\)](#)

Unless the hearing is continued upon a showing of good cause or the person who is a subject to the cause has admitted the allegations of the petition, an adjudicatory hearing shall be held within ninety (90) days after the filing of the petition to determine whether there is legally sufficient evidence to find that the child is a delinquent child, a child in need of supervision, a neglected child or an abused child. If the adjudicatory hearing is not held within the ninety (90) days, the petition shall be dismissed with prejudice.

If the child has been taken into custody, a disposition hearing shall be held within fourteen (14) days after the adjudicatory hearing unless good cause be shown for postponement.

(b) Reasonable efforts determination. . . .

(1) Judicial determination of reasonable efforts to prevent a child's removal from the home.

(i) When a child is removed from his/her home, the judicial determination as to whether reasonable efforts were made, or were not required to prevent the removal, in accordance with paragraph (b)(3) of this section, must be made no later than 60 days from the date the child is removed from the home pursuant to paragraph (k)(1)(ii) of this section.

(ii) If the determination concerning reasonable efforts to prevent the removal is not made as specified in paragraph (b)(1)(i) of this section, the child is not eligible under the title IV-E foster care maintenance payments program for the duration of that stay in foster care.

viii [§43-21-551\(3\)](#)

If the child is held in shelter, the hearing shall be held as soon as possible but not later than thirty (30) days after the child is first taken into custody unless the hearing is postponed:

(a) upon motion of the child;

(b) where process cannot be completed; or

(c) upon a judicial finding that a material witness is not presently available. If the adjudicatory hearing is not held or postponed for the aforesaid reasons, the child may be released from shelter.

ix [§43-21-601\(2\)](#)

If the child has been taken into custody, a disposition hearing shall be held within fourteen (14) days after the adjudicatory hearing unless good cause be shown for postponement.
